2011 ROGATION/COMPOSITE PROFESSIONALSUNDAY:
THE SALVATION PACKAGE IN THE AWESOME
RESURRECTION AND GLORIOUS ASCENSION OF
JESUS CHRIST!

(a) What is Rogation Sunday and the Rogation Days ?

Rogation (a contraction of the Latin word *ROGARE*), means SOLEMN SUPPLICATION FOR THE FRUITFULNESS OF HUMAN LIVELIHOOD AND THAT OF OUR LAND AND SEA AT HARVEST. The practice of *Rogare* was started with ritual practice in ancient pagan times, to ostensibly right the wrongs of unfavourable harvest. Through evolutionary processes , right to the time of “Christened” contemporary liturgy by the Church of England, the *Rogare* practice was “Christianed”, and took its modern terminology of **ROGATION**. Though the objectives of the ancient practice and that of the modern Rogation are largely similar; the focal subjects, are however, diametrically opposed. In ancient times, it was the lifeless idols that were appeased. Christians, however, supplicate to the **LIVING GOD**, the omniscient, the most Holy , the immutable and eternal God. The Christian Rogation thus have the attributes of an **ETERNAL GOD** and a **GREAT GOD**. This is so, because Christian Rogation is contextually based on two fundamental beliefs, that every Christian must faithfully appropriate for effectively-assured answered prayers. These beliefs are:

- (a) The Power of the Resurrection of our Saviour Jesus Christ, and
- (b) The Power of the Glorious Ascension of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. (The Risen Lord Ascended into Heaven with our **MANHOOD** and His **DIVINITY**. Thus the nature of humanity in the heavenly realms is spiritually enhanced and acknowledged !)

Rogation is most effectual and availeth much, if a Christian applies the power of Resurrection to “ASKING” on Rogation Sunday and Rogation Days (i.e. the last Sunday, and the first three week days before Ascension Day (June 2, 2011), and such prayers have been tested assuredly to start being divinely answered on Whitsunday or Pentecost Sunday (June 12th, 2011), along with the divine release and out pouring of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:1-4). All Christian brethren are again called upon, anew, to test the testament.

(b) Why Professional Harvest on Rogation Sunday?

This is an initiative of the 2010 Harvest Committee, used at achieving an admixture of Spiritful Cocktail since Rogation means **SOLEMN SUPPLICATION FOR THE FRUITFULNESS OF HUMAN LIVELIHOOD AND THAT OF OUR LAND AND SEA**. This one Sunday composite professional harvesting is a “rebranding ”that was begun in SPCB Lagos in 2010, to replace the erstwhile, long-drawn, serialized Professional Harvesting and rightfully incorporate it with the annual Rogation Sunday Service.

P – R – A – Y!

1 Chronicles 16:11 NIV says "Look to the Lord and His strength; seek His face always"

To help you remember the four parts of prayer, think of the acrostic P – R – A – Y.

P – Praise the Lord! Not sure how? Think you'll run out of words? Not if you use the scriptures. David gives us 2 beautiful example in 1 Chronicles 29:11-13. It's one you can use: 'Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendour. Yours, O Lord, is the kingdom... in your hands are strength and power to exalt and give strength to all. Now, our God, we give you thanks, and praise your glorious name.

R – Repent of your sins! Just as treat forces impurities to the surface so the metal refiner can remove them, your prayer time will reveal attributes that must be changed, habits that must be broken, and barriers to blessings that must be removed. It's not enough to tell God about your sins. He already know them. You must ask Him to help you turn away from them. This is true repentance.

A – Ask for yourself and others ! Your prayers invite God into the situation, and your faith activates His power to change it. There's no distance in prayer, no culture or language barrier it can't overcome. It's like throwing on a power switch; things begin to move when we pray. Jesus said, 'I will give you the key of the kingdom of Heaven.....whatever doors you open on earth shall be opened in Heaven (Matthew 16:19).

Y – Yield yourself to God's Will! Declaring the Lordship of Jesus Christ in your life is like signing HIS name to the bottom of a blank cheque, and inviting you to fill in the Amount.

Keep swimming in the Lagoon of His splendiferous blessings!

Exhortation: “Obey”

1. Greetings

(a) All worshippers are welcome into this sanctuary for the year 2011. We thank God for His mercies shown us in the past especially the year 2010. As we come to meet the Lord this year, let us rededicate our lives anew to Jesus Christ. Each time we enter this sanctuary, give thanks to Him, invite His presence, pray to Him for revival from sin to righteousness. Let us pray that our coming this year will attract divine intervention in our lives. Jesus has said, Ask, and it will be given you; seek and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened. (Matt. 7:7&8). Have confidence in the promise of our Lord Jesus that if we ask for bread we shall not be given a stone or when you ask for a fish, you will not be given a serpent (Mt. 7:9). Trust the Lord for His goodness and mercy, come to Him with a clean heart and be sure IT IS WELL.
