CHRIST LIKENESS

“When Christ is revealed, we shall be like Him for we shall see Him as He is” 1John 3:2.

Christ likeness is the process by which believers are conformed to the likeness of Jesus Christ. W.M. Whittemore wrote a popular hymn that is based on 1Peter 2:21 “Leaving us an example that ye should follow His steps”. Let us look at this hymn:

“I want to be like Jesus
So lowly and so meek
For no man marked an angry word
That ever heard Him Speak.”

Jesus Christ was very humble, very gentle, He left his throne in heaven to come to this world for our sake. He once told his disciples “Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave – just as the son of man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many” (Matthew 20:26-28). This is a good example for us. We are to humble ourselves and be prepared to serve in any capacity, no matter how lowly.

“I want to be like Jesus,
So frequently in prayer,
Alone upon the mountain-top,
He met HIS FATHER there”

Jesus was a man of prayer. In Luke 11:1, we were told one day Jesus was praying in a certain place, when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, Lord, teach us to pray,so we need to be people of prayer Jesus Christ endured a lot of sufferings for us 1Peter 2:21-23. To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in him. He committed no sin, and not deceit was found in his mouth, when they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate, when he himself suffered, he made no threat. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. “How comfortable do you feel reading that account of Jesus suffering”? Are you prepared to suffer for the sake of the gospel? Today we sing and clap, Me I no go suffer “Do you really want to be like Jesus” Then you must be prepared to suffer for Him.
