captivating and soul – lifting discussion, Bishop Dr. Adeyemi could be rightly described, not only as a BISHOP and MEDICAL SURGEON but clearly as a seasoned REVIVALIST, an eloquent EXPOSITOR, and prolific SONGSTER (he sang 24 choruses during his 85 minutes pulpit – discussion, making an average of 1 chorus every 3½ minutes) He expatiated that Rogare, past participle of Rogat, that become Christianized as ROGATION started in the 4th Century or 300 B.C. He stressed that Rogation has its original in the Bible, specifically in relation to the fortified 25ft tall x 20ft wide WALL OF JERICHO, which The Bible described as a demonic stronghold, that God needed to destroy, and which he did with 7 – day praise – singing and Alleluia ! Concerning the 2011 thematic scripture (Psalm 126) chosen by the Harvest Committee, he expatiated that Rogation is about spiritually – prayerful events to make our harvest bountiful in November when hold our harvest proper. In order words Rogation is a preparatory exercise for a favourable ending or harvesting, subject to whether we prepare properly (i.e. sow rightly and qualitatively) or not.

Bishop Adeyemi also emphasized that he loves carrying along his audience and the congregation through responsiveness and interactiveness. He admonished we should imbibe the following:

(a) have a change of mind-set;

(b) learn to appreciate and thank God through unrelenting praise – singing;

(c) be prayerfully – realistic, by being Bible – informed in offering prayers;

(d) have an afasted life to be able to seek the face of our living God, Thereby continually aiming to be in God’s presence;

(e) routinely commit our work, our livelihood (professions, occupations, harvest, all desires) to God;

(f) live a practical life, for Rogation makes things happen;

(g) have testimonially practical experience;

(h) have truthful, clean hands, and live a consistently obedient life;

(i) work with God, think Jesus Christ, with absolute faith;

(j) believe in rogation testimonial, because they are definitely accessible if conditions are right.

(k) actualize the perfect of Rogation Prayers by SOWING QUALITATIVELY and RIGHTLY into our professions, our marriages, our family, and our fortunes, as well as expected fortunes.

He concluded by emphasizing that ROGATION IS ABOUT PRAYER – RELATED EVENTS IN OUR CHRISTIAN LIVES. The May 29th represented a continued transformation of a tradition that effectively started in 2010 and took on an improved dimension in 2011. The Harvest Committee and the Altar Guild received accolades for an acclaimed remarkable-successful celebration. May our future formal annual harvest season preparations (our ROGATION) experience, even greater successful dimension in the future, in Jesus Name ! Amen.

A. Pre-Rogation

P – R – A – Y!

1 Chronicles 16:11 NIV says “Look to the Lord and His strength; seek His face always”

To help you remember the four parts of prayer, think of the acrostic P – R – A – Y.

P – Praise the Lord! Not sure how? Think, you’ll run out of words! Not if you use the scriptures. David gives us 2 beautiful examples in 1 Chronicles 29:11-13. It’s one you can use: ‘Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendour. Yours, O Lord, is the kingdom.... in your hands are strength and power to exalt and give strength to all. Now, our God, we give you thanks, and praise your glorious name.

R – Repent of your sins! Just as heat forces impurities to the Surface, so the metal refiner can remove them, your prayer time will reveal attributes that must be changed, habits that must be broken, and barriers to blessings that must be removed. It’s not enough to tell God about your sins. He already knows them. You must ask Him to help you turn away from them. This is true repentance.

A – Ask for yourself and others ! Your prayers invite God into the situation, and your faith activates His power to change it. There’s no distance in prayer, no culture or language barrier it can’t overcome. It’s like throwing on a power switch; things begin to move when we pray. Jesus said, ‘I will give you the key of the kingdom of Heaven.....whatever doors you open on earth shall be opened in Heaven (Matthew 16:19).

Y – Yield yourself to God’s Will ! Declaring the Lordship of Jesus Christ in your life is like signing His name to the bottom of a blank cheque, and inviting you to fill in the Amount.

Keep swimming in the Lagoon of His splendiferous blessings!
